News Letter No. 4

Dear Friend:

This is to wish you a Merry Christmas and Happy New Year. May all your affairs prosper, and may you have sound health and great happiness!

Everything is going on well at the College. Both the faculty and student body have shown excellent spirit. Our teachers have taken keen interest in the religious work. The new plan of small, intimate groups for spiritual cultivation (modified Sunday School) proved very successful. There are twenty-five such groups organized, with more than two hundred (fifty students enrolled). We had special evangelistic meetings in the latter part of November. Dr. F. K. Lee and Rev. Tseng Shao Hsien were the leaders. In the College we had nearly a full attendance of the student body.

The extension work program has been outlined and partially developed. Prof. J. B. Hippis, Dean of the Seminary, Mr. Fan Fan Shu, Extension Secretary, and the President, with several students, carried on deputations work in Yangchow, Chinkiang, and Wushu. Some members of our faculty also visited Hangchow, Ningchow, and Ninghsing. We are greatly interested in linking up the College more closely with the churches.

Recently we invited several leading Chinese pastors, Dr. T. C. Wu, of Hangchow, Rev. Chin Lien Chin of Ningpo, Rev. Chang Ping Yi of Chinkiang, Rev. Zang Pui Chi, of Soochow, and Rev. Tseng Shao Hsien of Shanghai, to meet with Dean J. B. Hippis, Dr. F. J. White, and myself to discuss the program of the Seminary. They all made valuable suggestions, and pledged to support the Seminary wholeheartedly (at least during the next five years). The Seminary has adopted an ambitious program, as follows: Four years' full course, one or more years; full College course, four years; short course, two years; special course, one year; non-resident course, unlimited time.

It has been the desire of the College not to turn away any poor but really worthy Christian youth. Several of our friends in America, England, and China, have sent us a number of scholarships. These gifts have been a great blessing to our students. With the assistance of the women's auxiliary on the campus,

we are developing a project for student self-help. One student is serving as a barber, several as waiters and gardeners, and a large number as clerks and attendants in the offices and library.

We wish our students to be not only good nationalists, but also internationalists, so we have organized an International Relations Club to study international problems. The corner room of the Library building has been set aside as an International Relations Library, to be in the care of the Department of Political Science and History. We have received material from the International Labour Office, the League of Nations, and other organizations.

The present building facilities are highly inadequate for our Yangtze Social Center, which is a part of our extension work. We are now conducting a campaign to raise \$10,000. We hope that this money can be raised very soon.

At the Fall meeting of the Board of Directors, several important actions were taken, among them a decision to secure the twelve new of land near our front gate. They voted to build another terrace of houses similar to the one just completed, one-half to be used as a teachers' club house. They approved the raising of scholarship funds to help poor but worthy students. They also discussed the need for a College Chapel, men's dining hall, and women's gymnasium and dining hall.

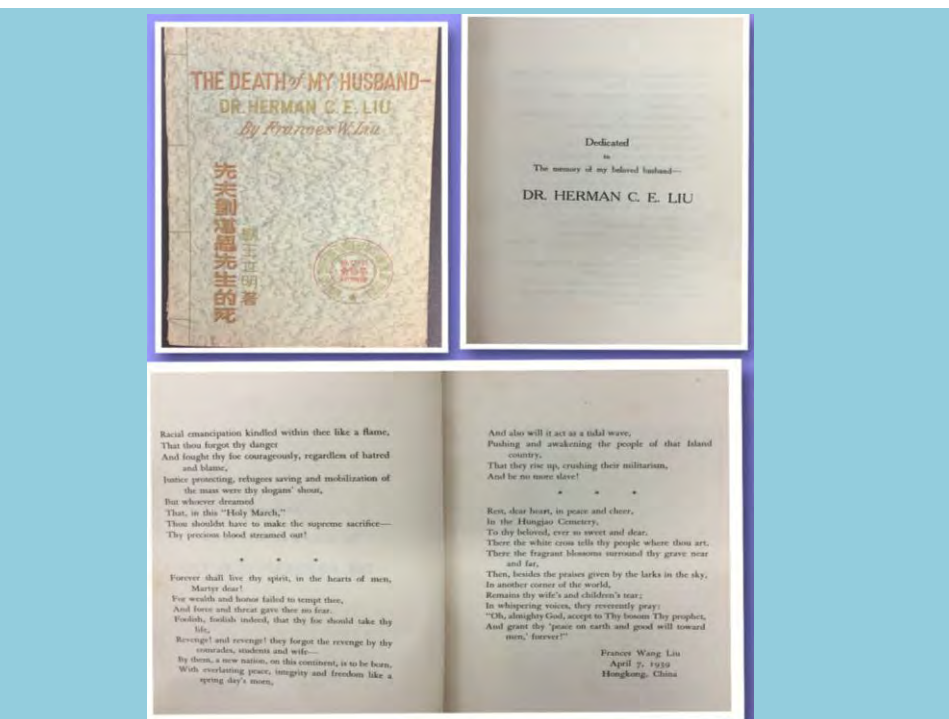
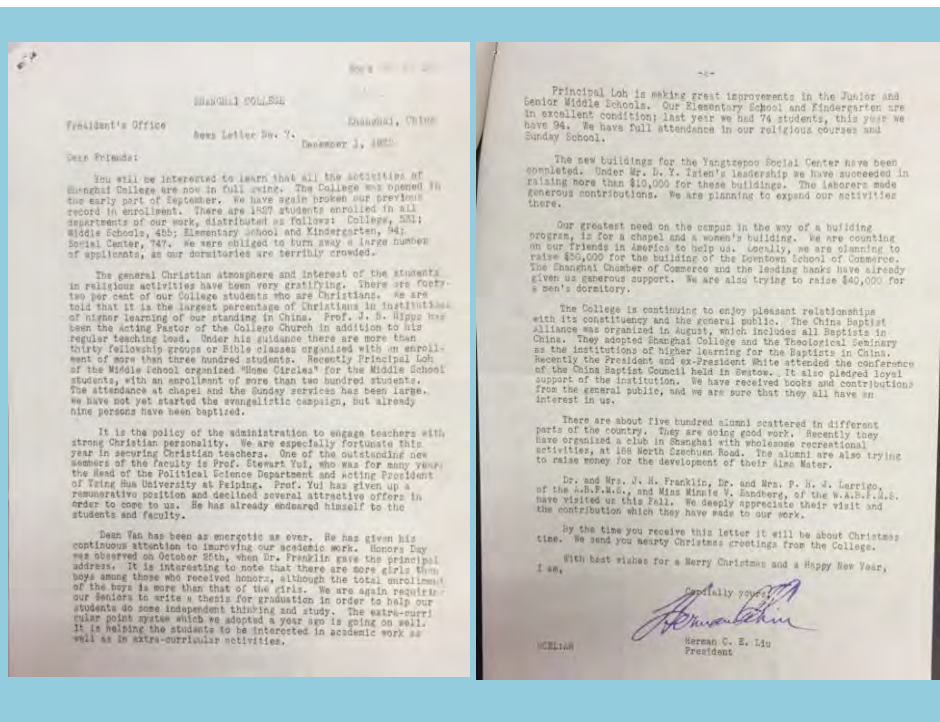
We held a Country Fair on November 15th, the anniversary of Dr. Sun Yat Sen's birthday, when the country and village people were entertained on the campus. Farm products were exhibited, and prizes given to those who raised the largest pumpkin, corn, chickens, etc. A prize was also given to the healthiest baby. A motion picture and popular scientific lectures were given free. The Country Fair is a part of our social service activities. We are anxious to train our students to serve the rural districts as well as the urban.

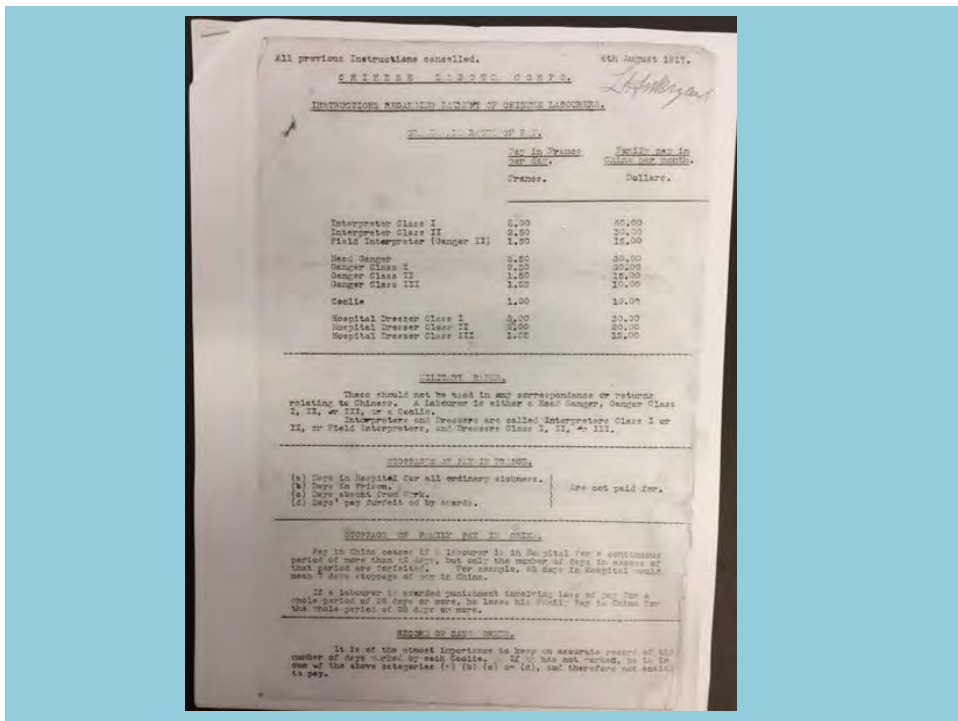
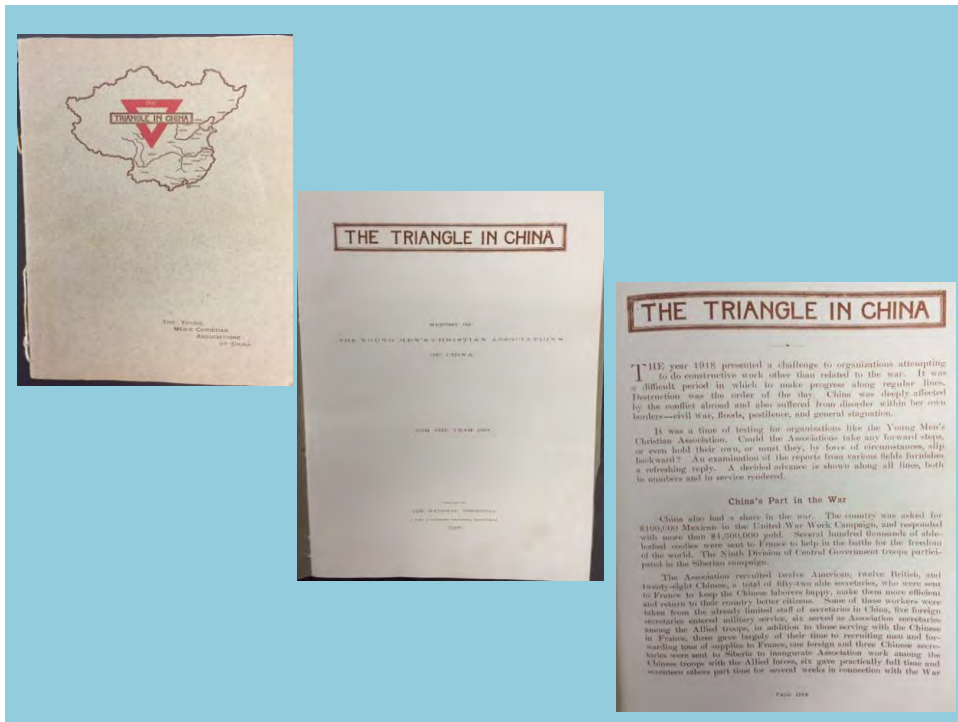
